## ABOUT THE PRESENTERS



### **Kelvin Moffatt - Ministry of Health**

Kelvin is currently Relationship Management Group Manager (Acting) in the Information Directorate, Ministry of Health. The Group aims to recognise and assess the needs of stakeholders in a strategic and planned way and provide a first point of contact in the form of Relationship Managers, including a dedicated Vendor Relationship Manager. Kelvin joined the Ministry in 2005 as Strategy and Development Manager for HealthPAC.

He has an extensive background in health having worked in both Asia and Europe for various organisations over the last 20 years.



### **Andrew Holmes - Ministry of Health**

Andrew has recently taken up the role of Principal Advisor, Information Strategy and Architecture Group, in the Information Directorate at the Ministry of Health. Previously as Manager, Outcomes Performance Systems he sponsored Key Directions for the Information Environment a phased programme of investments and business case development. The first phase has Cabinet approval and is being initiated. Most significantly, the first phase of Key Directions also delivers the business case for the next step towards eHealth and, as such, delivers a refreshed eHealth strategy and costed implementation plan.

Andrew is an Otago medical graduate, trained as a paediatrician at Children's Hospital of Buffalo, NY, and as a public health medicine specialist at Johns Hopkins University, Maryland.



### **Alison McDonald - Ministry of Health**

Alison is currently managing Phase One of the Key Directions Programme in her role as Portfolio Manager (Acting) within the Information Strategy and Architecture Group in the Information Directorate, Ministry of Health.

Alison has an extensive background in public policy development and management across the public sector, with a specific focus on engaging citizens and communities in public policy issues. Alison managed the Capitation Payments and Information Workstream of the National Systems Development initiative to a successful conclusion in June 2008. This programme included much of the planning activity for Phase One of Key Directions.



### **Quentin Wilson - Ministry of Health**

Quentin is Sector Services Group Manager in the Information Directorate at the Ministry of Health. The Group is responsible for providing services to health system stakeholders, including claims and agreement management, payments to providers, data collection and data release. Quentin was previously Group Manager of HealthPAC. Quentin's first job in the health sector was at Southern Cross Healthcare, where he was Chief Operating Officer Insurance.

Before joining the health sector, Quentin worked at AMP as an accountant and in several different executive positions in Australia and New Zealand. He led some large due diligence teams for AMP before acting as Managing Director in New Zealand for six months.



### **Ross McKenna - Ministry of Health**

Ross McKenna is Portfolio Manager (Acting) for the Ministry's Connected Health Programme. The aim of the Programme is to support connectivity that enables health providers to share and access medical data and information securely.

Ross previously worked at the Department of Internal Affairs as Programme Director for the Electronic Monitoring System and establishing the Strategic Technology and Risk Group within the Gambling Compliance area. Ross has broad experience in technical and management roles in the ICT industry in Australia and New Zealand - more recently focusing on large infrastructure programmes.



### **Alicia Webb - Ministry of Health**

Alicia leads the Identity Data Management team, responsible for managing the National Health Index and the Health Practitioner Index. Because ethnicity is a key data element associated with identity, Alicia also facilitates the pan-Ministry co-ordination of activity around ethnicity data collection, recording and use.

Alicia has spent several years working in health sector organisations: in Auckland and Bay of Plenty DHBs and private accident and medical clinics.

### **Genny Wilson - Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC)**

Genny is a Senior Project Manager with ACC and has delivered a range of technical, business and legislative projects, including within the primary sector. Genny has been with ACC for 15 years and in addition to project management, has operational and change management experience. She is currently managing the Secure Mail project, which is tasked with implementing a secure email solution within the Health and Disability Sector.
